SYMPOSIUM On May 29th, 2024, the Industrial Heritage Trail celebrated its 25th anniversary with more than 600 guests from all over Europe at the Zollverein UNESCO World Heritage Site. In the following months, the various industrial heritage sites and networks throughout the Ruhr region were the focus of the anniversary events and gave an impression of the diversity and remarkable growth of the once niche sector of industrial heritage.

In this respect, the International Building Exhibition Emscher Park (1989—1999) is generally regarded as a catalyst for decisive developments in the Ruhr region.

As a result, industrial heritage has developed an enormous dynamic in the region as well as in other areas of Germany and Europe and became a driving force in the field of land transformation.

Today, cities are objects of constant renegotiation. Growing competition for space between residential, green, industrial and commercial areas, poses challenges for all of the involved actors, as do resource shortages and demands of modern mobility. Working environments are changing fundamentally, and commercial locations must respond to new quality requirements. Social planning aspects will also become increasingly important.

The symposium marking the end of the 25th anniversary of the Industrial Heritage Trail is dedicated to these topics. The symposium is organized by the Ruhr Regional Association in cooperation with Baukultur NRW, the Foundation for the Preservation of Industrial Monuments and Historical Culture, and the European Route of Industrial Heritage.
